We saw Tailwind G-BDAP, Cessna 152's BAUV, BHSA & BILR, a Davis small V-tail- the first on the British register BPFL, cc150 BABH, PA-32 BOTV ex N36Q39 c/n 7885153, PA-34T EBSD ex N33086 c/n 7570085, Ce 152 BOGC ex N5346M c/n 84550, all from Jersey.

Then on to Bagby, with G-BOBO Cc172 ex C-GSMF c/n 70299, Ce150 AVMD, AVGV, Pup AXUA, M6.880 AYYK, Robin BBPW & Jodel BDWX. On through York to Pocklington, where there was only one new resident, a tandem Falke G-WOLD, also G-FUZZ PA-18, G-BGMV Falke and a PA-25. At Humberstone there was Bristow latest, a Bell 412 G-SPBA, like a 212 with 4 rotor blades. Other helicopters were Dauphins G-BLUP, BLUO, on skids: BGKM & BGNM, Bell 212 BJJP, PA-28 OKEN and Citation 2 F-GFJL.

Bits Catterick (RAF fire school) moved out in November, & no aircraft remain. The Princess Royal will open a new hostel & stable block at Redcar Racecourse on 1/8, and be at Whitby on 29th June.

The M1 737 crash pilot, Kevin Hunt, was well known to CFS members, and had until recently been a BMA DC-9 pilot on the TIA-LHR run.

The CAA will start tests of the SIVE water-sprinkler system on a 707 fuselage at Cardington soon, & hope to have a prototype system by 1992.

On 13/12, a DC-9 pilot with 96 pob claimed 3 JPs came within 200 ft of him over the Catterick area at 12,500 Ft at around 10 am. The RAF claimed the Linton jets were 500 ft above & 5 mls away.

On 28/12 an F-111 had engine trouble & flew over South Bank trailing smoke as it made for Leeming at low level.

On 9/11 a 737 going to LHR had birds ingested on take-off from Teesside with 60 pax. It landed & the flight was delayed 2 hrs until 4 pm. About 20 birds were found on the runway. On 15/11 the early LHR flight was cancelled due to fog at LHR.

On 4/1 a 77 yrs-old French pilot, a retired aircraft dealer, successfully landed his recently-repaired Ce150 (F-BSIY) in a field in Kent, diverting from Arras-Le Touquet because of low cloud. A Sea King was scrambled from Manston & while making a low pass, the down-draught turned the Cessna onto its back, causing extensive damage.

On 9/1, a Bristow S-76 travelling to Humberside from a rig & then on to Gt.Yarmouth an hour later had a Tornado near-miss (100 ft) on each leg of its journey.

Brigadier George Kennedy (ex Gordon Highlanders) has taken command of 24 Airmobile Brigade at Catterick Garrison.

A store manager who delayed a BA Gatwick departure by nearly 4 hours with a bomb hoax, because he thought his girl friend would miss it got 12 months jail.

B.T.Hunter.Teesside Movements Review- December 1988

Most Decembers are rather quiet in movements, and this one was no exception, with far fewer and little to get excited about. Biz-jets supplied some joy, with no fewer than four American-registered Gulfstream movements using three different aircraft and all three marks. The German Falcon 50, D-BFFB, seems set to become a regular too, with another couple of visits.

Military movements, while still few, are at least an improvement on last month, and include a rare stop-over by a Canberra on the 19th. A trooping flight from Germany gave us our first VC-10 in quite a long time.

A charter flight on behalf of B.P. was the reason for the BUSY BEE F.27 LN-AKB, night-stopping on the 22nd and this was a first visit by this aircraft.

Helicopters showed some interest, with an Army Agusta on the 8th, the Hughes 269 on the 12th and the BOND Super Puma, also on the 12th, which called for fuel, 'went tec' and stayed for 24 hours!

FLIGHT REFUELING's Ce441 G-FRAX kept popping in and out with spares and engineers for the Dorniers, and Middlesbrough F.C. used the based AIR UK F.27 to go to Norwich for a first-division match on the last day of the month. The aircraft changed at Norwich, as will be noted in the log. In keeping with the rest, diversions were also low key, with just three from Leeds and one light aircraft returning to Teesside when the weather down south looked bad. Crew training was fairly active with even some of the military identified at last and DAN-AIR bringing 111, 727 and 737 aircraft.

BRITISH MIDLAND news mainly concerns the greater use of DC.9-30's now that the Irish 737-200 has returned to its owners. To this end more -32's have been acquired, PKBD and 'BE being new, and BMWD again being leased from ADRIA, this time for 18 months. Details of first visits, etc, are given in the schedules notes.

NB The crash of the 737-400 G-OBME near East Midlands, together with the grounding of sister aircraft G-OBMF has meant that more planes will have to be leased in- already TEA 737-2M8 OO-TEL is known to be in service. Delivery of another 737 in the 300/400 series, the fifth of an order for 6, was due on 10th January.

On 22.11.88, ex-Wing Commander 'Taffy' Holden, 62, a retired RAF engineer sat in a Lightning by invitation and recalled an accident in 1966 at RAF Lyneham. He was making engine and taxiing trials when he pushed the throttle too far open and engaged reheat. He had to swerve to avoid a tanker, then narrowly missed a Comet which had just taken off before realising that not much runway remained & there was a village ahead. The Lightning had neither radio nor canopy, and the ejector seat was locked in for ground servicing. Having had to take off, he thus had to land it, and managed on his fourth attempt, downwind to minimise danger to houses, and with no parachute brake.

Mr. David Kirke of the Dangerous Sports Club flew his £15,000 prop-driven flying saucer 100 ft up above London's Dockland on 15.11.88, in a trial run before a Sahara flight sometime in 1989. It had to be tethered to meet CAA regulations.
